Introduction



IBH Addiction Recovery is an evidence-based provider of a continuum of care treatment approach for drug and alcohol addiction.

IBH Addiction Recovery provides an integrated system of services that address all aspects of drug and alcohol addiction and offers a variety of pathways to recovery. Treatment plans are designed to accommodate the specific needs of each client. They include outpatient and residential programs along with additional medical, mental health, spiritual, and aftercare support.

With a staff composed of individuals with clinical licenses, drug and alcohol counseling certifications, specialized training, and persons in recovery, IBH Addiction Recovery treats drug and alcohol addiction as a disease. Our team of experts works with clients to address the physical and mental impact of addiction, educates them on the underlying causes of the disease, and offers spiritual support.

History and Expansion



IBH Addiction Recovery, originally known as the Interval Brotherhood Home, was founded in 1970 to help those struggling with alcoholism.

IBH Addiction Recovery began as a residential treatment center that was rooted in the 12-step recovery program. Over the years, our services and programs have evolved to meet the needs of our client base with a focus on the treatment of both drug and alcohol addiction.

IBH Addiction Recovery is located on the same 70 acres of serene, rolling grounds near Portage Lakes as when it first opened back in 1970. Purchased from the Carmelite Monks, the property originally included a monastery, farmhouse, pole barn, and chicken coops. Over the years, the existing structures have been renovated and remodeled – and two new buildings added – all to meet the changing needs of IBH Addiction Recovery's staff and clients.

Today, the original monastery and chapel are now known as the Men's Residence, while the white farmhouse, built in 1844, is home to Administration Offices. Two of the large chicken coops, from which the monks used to sell eggs, were converted into a Women's Residence in the early 1980s and features semiprivate and dorm-style rooms. The utilitarian pole barn was transformed into a building that was leased out to other organizations, such as Community Support Services and The Village Network, over the years. More recently, the former pole barn has been used as an expansion of the Men's Residence.

The two newer structures include a Therapy Center and Education Center. The Therapy Center, built in the mid-1980s, houses counseling services, an auditorium for in-service programs, and office space. The Education Center, the newest building, includes a full-size gym complete with modern elliptical equipment, treadmills, stationary bikes, and cable-type workout centers.

Expanding to Meet New Challenges

IBH Addiction Recovery expanded its physical footprint with the addition of our **Firestone Park Outpatient and Aftercare Facility** in the fall 2021. Conveniently located on the METRO RTA bus line and a short distance from both downtown Akron and our Main Campus, the newly renovated building houses our Outpatient Programs and the IBH REACH Program that provides aftercare support.

The Firestone Park Outpatient and Aftercare Facility has many features that will improve how IBH Addiction Recovery delivers our drug and alcohol addiction treatment.

Meeting Rooms

With both large and private rooms, there is ample space for community events and support meetings.

Computer Lab

The lab provides computers and internet access to outpatient and aftercare clients to work on job applications, build resumes, or search for reliable housing.

Drop-In Center

Set in a coffee shop-like atmosphere, the drop-in center provides a place for clients to connect with others or receive positive reinforcement.

Referral Resources

Onsite peer support and referral services are available to assist clients in finding additional outpatient programs and levels of care to continue their recovery.

Residential Treatment

Our most intense level of care that includes on campus living, 24/7 support, and more than 40 hours of direct recovery services per week.

Day Treatment

Based on the partial hospitalization model, Day Treatment is a short-term, outpatient approach to drug and alcohol addiction treatment.

Outpatient Programs

Our Outpatient Programs, which include an Intensive Outpatient option, are designed to facilitate relapse management, and provide coping strategies through treatment and support services.

Aftercare / IBH REACH Program

A peer-based aftercare program that reinforces the values learned during treatment, while providing a practical application of recovery skills.
